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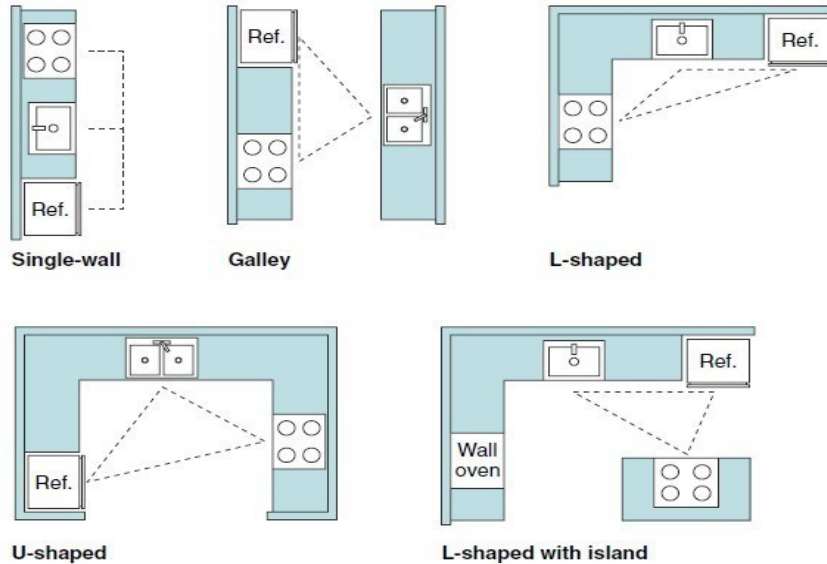
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How to Measure a Kitchen (or Bathroom).

Take all room measurements in inches.

1. Wall Lengths— Measure each wall from the left side wall to the right side wall
2. Windows & Doors—Measure the width of the window or door from the left outside edge to the right outside edge. If the window or door has trim, measure from the outside edges of the trim.
3. Windows—Measure height of window, wall height above and below the window, including the distance from the bottom of the window to the countertop.
4. Sinks centered under a Window—Measure the width of the sink, then measure from the center of the sink to the left wall and from center of the sink to the right wall. Make note on the floor plan where the sink is in relation to the window.
5. Ceilings—Measure ceiling height at each end of a wall. (Not all ceilings are level!)
